PREFATORY NOTE

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It may be said that little can be known about Russia by one who has not been there, but the difficulty that travellers without knowledge of Russian experience in arriving at the facts under present conditions is generally recognised, and Professor Haensel, who was for seven years a financial adviser to the Soviet Government, in his Economic Policy of Soviet Russia, recommends a study of translations of the Soviet Press as the best means of arriving at some understanding of the Soviet régime. These, and The Selection of Documents

Relative to the Labour Legislation in force in the U.S.S.R., recently officially published in this country, are the chief authorities for my main theme.

As this is the work of a private Member of the House of Commons, it represents the views of no one except the writer.
