INTRODUCTION

SO many new readers of THE DAILY TELEGRAPH, and so many old Crossword Solvers, have asked for a second book of puzzles that its welcome is assured.

The fifty puzzles reprinted here, like those in the earlier book, have already appeared in THE DAILY TELEGRAPH. Here and there a clue has been made more topical in its allusion, but nothing has been done to detract from the originality and humour which has always been a notable feature of THE DAILY TELEGRAPH daily Crossword.

The Crossword Puzzle has very definitely become a habit in the lives of all sorts and conditions of men, women and children. Contrary to all the prognostications of even its most enthusiastic votaries, this engaging form of amusement has long gone beyond what the actuarially inclined called its "expectation of life." True, like all cults, it has had its vicissitudes. Once or twice during the past few years the flame began to flicker—but only to revive, quite spontaneously, to still greater heights of popularity. This, after all, has its corollary even in the inner circle of daily devotees. When one or two of them have been gathered together, there surely have been heard shameful confessions of a week's backsliding; and a famous Club still smarts under the ignominy of looking back to one bleak fortnight when every copy of THE DAILY TELEGRAPH contained a clean unpencilled puzzle.

Not that the regular solver is without some excuse for his failures. What true adherent of any great cause has been more harried, seamed and persecuted for his absorption—not merely in train, tram, bus or tube, but in the very sanctity of his home?

But these disabilities have been overcome. Subjected to more contumely and exasperation than the wireless fan, tempted to "give it up" even more often than the miserable golfer, the Crossword enthusiast always rises superior to his trials. Indeed,

the very fact that on these occasions he has been able to express his feelings in more varied (if less forcible) language than his fellow-sufferers does afford him the consolation that his exercise has at least widened, rather than restricted, his vocabulary!

But perhaps the greatest triumph of the Crossword Puzzle is that it has survived the most blatant efforts to commercialize it. The vision of glittering prizes on one side, and on the other a despair of ever beating odds of a thousand million to one against a correct solution, have been powerless to degrade the regular solver from his or her amateur status, or to disturb the steady main stream of popularity.

For this happy state, THE DAILY TELEGRAPH daily Crossword puzzle can take some credit. Day by day, year in and year out, the puzzle has admittedly maintained a consistency which has amazed those who have solved it regularly since its inception. Neither too hard nor too easy, leavened with wit and humour, calling for mental energy enough to stimulate the sluggish and keep the clever brain alert, it has set an example which has been imitated in almost every county in the world.
